#### Katharina Rieke - Alumna

My name is Katharina and I attended the European School in Mol, Belgium. Mol you ask? Well, it might be a mystery school among the more known European Schools in Brussels but it does exist in the province of Antwerp and it was the third European School, after Luxembourg and Brussels I, to open in 1960.

I was born in Germany and both my parents are German. When I was four years old, they moved with me to Belgium and today, I am a German as well as Belgian citizen. We moved because my father had a job opportunity in Antwerp. Initially, we were only supposed to stay for two years. This is how my European School "career" started in 1992. My parents wanted me to attend kindergarten in German to make it easier for me once we returned to Germany, but we ended up never leaving Belgium and in 2006, I obtained my European Baccalaureate from Mol.

I enjoyed my time at the European School a lot. Mol is a rather small school and when I was there, we had a particularly small German section. In the final two years before my graduation, there were only two German girls in my class. It was wonderful because the teachers could focus on each of our learning needs. For our language classes, geography and history, gym etc. we were together with the rest of the class year. Sometimes there were days when I did not like being the focus of attention in my German or math classes but in hindsight, the individual attention was very helpful and the best education I could ever get.

Going through this school experience, made me feel very enthusiastic about the European Union and its future. In 2006, I therefore decided to study European Law at the University of Maastricht and graduated in 2011. I completed a Bachelor as well as a Masters degree and also took advantage of the Erasmus Semester abroad. I studied in Dublin and I had a second exchange in Bordeaux.

And where did I end up? In Brussels...where else? I am working for a German Member of the European Parliament since 2013 and visited Mol again this year. It was good to see the school again. Not much has changed, except for a fresh coat of paint and a few new items here and there. A modern version of what I had remembered, and it made me feel nostalgic. I am hoping that all students attending the European School in Mol today are having the same great experience that I had!

### 60 Years - The European School Brussels 1

The Alumni Europae Board is thrilled to announce that Alumni Europae asbl will be based, legally and physically, in the premises of the Chateau located in the heart of the first European School in Brussels. The Director, Mrs. Antonia Ruiz Esturella, kindly invited us to come back to our roots and celebrate the  $60^{\rm th}$  anniversary of the European School Brussels 1. Many thanks! The birthday demonstrated what a European School is about. It consists of a great community, students young and old, teachers, parents, and alumni. Also attending were some alumni from the very first days in the building of "rue du Trone" back in 1958.

Stéphane Millet, a senior Alumnus who received his degree in 1966, has published a book entitled "Avenue des Verts Chasseurs" (Edition L'Harmattan) outlining his memories and experiences in the very early days of our school.

Stéphane describes the characteristics in the early days, which except for the Chateau, always adapted to the growing needs and necessities typical for a dynamic institution. The location of the "parc" with its trees and open space has yielded to new facilities for a growing student body. Today, there are in excess of 3.000 pupils compared to a significantly smaller number of 1.000, from when the school was founded. Important elements such as the feeling of community amongst the pupils, teachers, parents and alumni fortunately remain.

The Alumni Europae was happy to participate at the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration of the European School in Brussels and had the opportunity to introduce itself. Unfortunately, only a handful of Alumni know about us and what we do. Luckily, we were able to meet some older alumni who came back to "their" school and we reestablished old contacts. It was helpful to hear from all the alumni what they expect from an alumni network. Clearly, we will need to adapt what we offer to alumni. Here the message was clear:

- 1. We need more local events
- 2. We need more business contacts amongst the alumni. Two alumni are already setting up our Linkedin and Facebook presence
- 3. We need a clear message for our mission. An alumnus, from Luxemburg, will set up the branding
- 4. A Board with more frequent exchange of information.

We have started a new experience for our alumni and have invested our capital in a new IT system. This was a necessary step towards an advanced and modern alumni network and we hope that this will pay off. We invite all of you to join us and other alumni at
