### Campaign timeline:

- End date: Friday, 6 December

For families who wish to participate, we warmly encourage your children to get involved. On our end, we are committed to presenting this project in class in an educational manner tailored to each age group.

### What can we contribute?

Here are some examples of items that can be included in the solidarity bags:

- Non-perishable food items: pasta, cereals, canned goods, dry products, etc.
- Personal hygiene products: shampoo, soap, toothbrush, etc.
- **New toys**: a small gift that your child can choose and buy with their pocket money.
- Children's books in French, English, or Spanish.
- Warm clothing for adults.
